The students were able to talk to individuals from the various organisations about future opportunities as well as being able to find out about the variety of career opportunities available.

Our students enjoyed attending the convention and found it very useful in helping them make decisions regarding their future and in understanding the different routes available to them.

The staff who accompanied the students were very proud of them including the way they interacted with employers and further education providers. Some employers commented on how well prepared our students were for this event.

- Don't answer calls from withheld numbers or numbers you don't recognise, let it go to voicemail.
- Block numbers from people who are sending you nasty messages.
- If you are bullied repeatedly you can change your number.
- Don't give your mobile number to someone you don't know.
- Don't send pictures to someone you don't know.
- If the problem is serious you can report it to the police, cyber mentors, or childline.








STEM Activities 2019


