Advice to All Parents - positive case in a school September 21

Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to inform you that we have been notified that there have been some confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 this week at The Thomas Lord Audley School. This letter is being sent to Parents and Carers of all year groups because each year group has at least one positive case, and although we do not believe there to be any link, we do want to raise your awareness about the situation.

This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child. Please be reassured that for most young people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

In line with the latest government guidelines that were released in August 2021, identified close contacts who are under 18 years and 6 months of age, do not need to self-isolate. Instead, they are advised to get a COVID-19 PCR test if NHS Track and Trace contacts you or they start to show symptoms of Covid-19.

If your child is identified as a close contact by NHS Test and Trace your child should continue attending school and you should arrange from them to have a PCR COVID-19 test. Only if this test is positive or your child is displaying one of the three COVID-19 symptoms do they need to refrain from school and self-isolate.

If your child does test positive for Covid-19 they should stay at home for the 10-day isolation period and the school will arrange remote education so that they can continue their learning, if they are well enough to do so. Remote education will not be extended to children who are absent for other reasons.

We have already asked that all students take two Lateral Flow Tests at home each week. In light of these cases, we strongly encourage all families to ensure this becomes part of their normal, weekly routine. We anticipate that additional packs of tests will be received in school for us to distribute to students in the near future. If you receive a positive result from a lateral flow test, you should seek a PCR as soon as possible and then follow the isolation guidance as above.

We will continue to review our risk assessment and outbreak management plan and adhere to the protective measures in place at school. These measures include hygiene and cleaning measures and keeping spaces well ventilated.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the day after their symptoms appeared or until a negative PCR test result is received. Anyone with symptoms

should seek a PCR test and this can be arranged via https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119.

Household members no longer need to isolate if they are under 18 years of age or are double vaccinated.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands)
 when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
